

Improving Test Scores and Grade Point Averages

- By boosting computer competency, math and language skills, SEA's curriculum elevates a student's GPA — on average — by more than one point.
- The longer a student stays at SEA, the greater the increase in their GPA.
- As of 2006, students added 126 points to the school's Academic Performance Index, the state's measure of academic performance and school growth.

Increasing Graduation Rates

- Nearly 90% of senior students graduate with a high school diploma.
- One-third of those continue on with more education.

Providing Other Opportunities to Learn and Grow

- 91% of students participate in one or more service-learning leadership activities.
- From 2005 to 2007, six out of 10 students participating in job skills training were placed in a job.
- Each year, 50 students, parents, teachers and administrators meet with elected officials in Sacramento to discuss the legislative process and advocate for at-risk youth.
- All students participate in trips to Camp Eaton to experience nature and develop greater self-esteem and communication skills.

Staying on the Right Path

- Of the students enrolled at SEA in 2004-2005 as required by their parole — about half the student body — 82% have avoided trouble with the law since leaving.
- The longer a student is at SEA, the less likely they are to violate their probation.
- 94% of graduates between 1998 and 2003 were confirmed to be working or in college.
